Around the World in Seven Days

On January 30, 2016, in Sydney, Australia, Becca Pizzi made history. **21** What does it mean to “make history”? She became the first woman from the United States to finish the World Marathon Challenge (WMC). The challenge: run seven marathons (26.2 miles per marathon) in seven consecutive days on all seven continents.

[1] Due to this grueling schedule of running and flights, participants sleep on the plane. [2] WMC participants travel the **22** globe; stopping for races in Union Glacier (Antarctica), Punta Arenas (South America), Miami (North America), Madrid (Europe), Marrakech (Africa), Dubai (Asia), and Sydney (Australia). [3] Each person who completes the challenge **23** run 183 miles and flies almost 60 hours over the seven-day period. [4] Pizzi explains, “It’s run, eat, sleep, repeat. We average 10 hours per continent.” **24**
